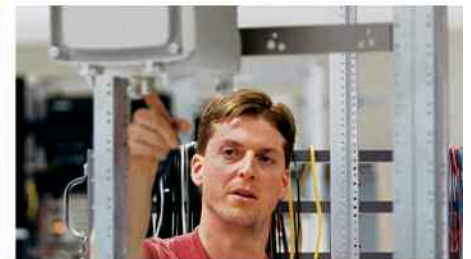

NETCENTS Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is NETCENTS?

A: The purpose of the Air Force Network-Centric Solutions (NETCENTS) contract is to provide a primary source of networking equipment/product supply and a means of system engineering, installation, integration, operations, and maintenance for a family of Department of Defense (DoD) adopted, commercially standardized, networking solutions that are interoperable with Air Force, Joint, and DoD Standardized Networking Technical Architectures.

Q: What does the NETCENTS contract include?

A: The NETCENTS contract includes the following products and services:

- Net-Centric Information Technology
- Networking
- Telephony
- Security
- Voice, Video, and Data Communications
- Commercial-off-the-Shelf (COTS) Products
- System Solutions
- Engineering Services
- Systems Hardware and Software
- Warranty
- Systems Management, Operations, and Maintenance Support
- Configuration Management
- Training
- Centralized Logistics and Inventory Management Support
- Depot Level Support, Spares, or Supplies
- Outsourcing and Services Support
- Engineering/IT/ Specialty Experts

Q: What initiatives will NETCENTS support?

A: NETCENTS will support all DoD and U.S. Government major initiatives and programs such as the Air Force's Global Information Grid (GIG) architecture, Defense Information System Network (DISN), Defense Switch Network (DSN), Defense Message System (DMS), Air Force System Network (AFSN) (Secret Internet Protocol Router Network (SIPRNet), Nonclassified Internet Protocol Router Network (NIPRNet)), Defense Research and Engineering Network (DREN), and Combat Information Transport Systems (CITS) program.

Q: Who is eligible to use NETCENTS?

- A:
- AF Organizations at All Levels (MAJCOMs, Bases, and Program Offices)
 - Program Offices
 - Combat Information Transport System
 - Air Force Systems Networking
 - Ogden ALC (Voice Switch Maintenance)
 - AF Communications Agency
 - Air Force Research Laboratory (AFRL) and other R&D
 - DoD Agencies (Including Army and Navy)
 - Federal Agencies

Q: How are delivery orders placed?

A: Orders are placed in accordance with the NETCENTS Ordering Guide available via web at

<https://ossg.gunter.af.mil/aq/netcents/homepage.aspx>

In general, delivery orders may be competed via full and open competition amongst all eight contractor teams,

or

Competed as a set-aside requirement for one to four small business contracts teams to bid,

or

Placed via Online Order via NETCENTS Portal (Single Vendor Rationale required if only one vendor is listed).

Q: Does a NETCENTS delivery order go directly to Harris Corporation for the required products and services?

A: No. The Government awarded NETCENTS Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contracts to eight contractor teams. Harris GCSD is a subcontractor to General Dynamics Network Systems and The CENTECH Group. Harris will routinely receive delivery orders from their prime contractor—either General Dynamics or CENTECH.

Q: What is the cost of using the NETCENTS contract?

- A:
- Usage Fee—1.0% fee for all agencies
 - Applied by Contractor and remitted back to USAF
 - New fee percentage applied at beginning of each FY

Q: What are some of the benefits of using the NETCENTS contract vehicle?

- A:
- No requirement to synopsise orders (saves 30 days)
 - Facilitates purchase of networking equipment not on GSA schedule
 - Great way to purchase capability when exact system solution not known and engineering services required
 - Ideal contract vehicle for “turnkey” systems with O&M
 - Streamlined online ordering for specific product and/or services
